GUESSING GAME

We associate Europe with a community of values, comprising numerous countries. This political success of the European Union which we take for granted has only celebrated its 70th anniversary. Often, European culture and the individual nations' diversity drift into oblivion.

FACTS is an entertaining guessing game that will make you more closely acquainted with Europe's diversity in a surprising way.

PREPARATION

1. PRINT

Print the game material one-sided, true to size, and in black and white.

Note that each player needs to have their own game map.

2. CUT

Cut out the cards along the dotted lines, without reading questions and answers.

3. FOLD

Fold the cards along the double lines so that the questions ("Location", "Date") and answers can be read on the outsides.

4. SHUFFLE

Shuffle the folded cards and form a deck.

5. DISTRIBUTE

Each player receives their own game map, solution ruler and point ruler. Make sure to print the right number of copies.






INSTRUCTIONS

1. Guessing

In questions where the answer is a **position**, you will mark the spot where you assume the wanted place to be on the Europe map. In questions where the answer is a **date**, you will use the timeline and mark the spot where you assume the wanted year to be. Use crosses (X) for your answers.




2. Solving

The solutions will be presented to you in one or two letters that you are to read like dots in a coordinate system. Look for the solution's letter on the ruler. Now hold the ruler to the game map, as shown in the example on the left. The first letter ("J") refers to the x axis, the second letter ("D") to the y axis of the Europe map.

3. Scoring

Now hold the tip of the point ruler to the solution and place the ruler in such a way as to connect the solution with your answer. You will receive the number of points indicated in the section of the ruler where your answer is located. The example on the right shows the player receiving 3 points. When scoring the date questions, proceed in exactly the same way (see image on the far right).



GAMEPLAY

QUESTIONS

Start the round by reading out loud the question on the top card on the deck. The questions refer either to a location or a date.

1. GUESS

Mark your guess on your game map (Europe map or timeline) with a pen and note the number of the turn right next to it (example here: "1.").

2. SOLVE

Flip the question card, read the solution out loud, and identify the location or date sought using the solution ruler.

3. SCORE

Determine the points for your answer using the point ruler and enter them into the chart. This finishes the round.

WIN


The game ends after 10 rounds. The player who gains the most points wins the game.
